The premier of the Australian state of New South Wales (NSW), Barry O'Farrell, witnessed the signing of memoranda of understanding (MoU) between five Indian schools and the Association of Independent Schools of NSW (AISNSW). Under the new agreement, the association will provide high quality professional training courses to principals and senior executives in Indian schools.

The signing took place at the Holy Child Auxilium School in New Delhi where AISNSW had been conducting a leadership training session for 90 teachers and executive staff from the school.

At the signing event premier O'Farrell said, "The signing of the MoUs is a significant step towards an ongoing, two-way learning and development ex-

change benefiting teachers, staff and students, in both India and NSW."

Under the MoUs, the association will provide training to five schools in India, including the Holy Child Auxilium School, Vibgyor High in Mumbai, the Suncity World School in Gurgaon, the Samhita Academy in Bangalore and Saraswathi Vidyalaya in Trivandrum.

"Quality education is the foundation for future prosperity and is critical for the continued development, growth and flexibility of any economy. I congratulate the association on this initiative which will not only provide training to Indian schools, but also help NSW teachers to gain insight and understanding of different educational contexts and practices."

AISNSW is the leading organisation

representing the independent schooling sector in NSW and advocates on behalf of more than 440 schools and 175,000 students. The association is a well-established training provider, delivering education, training and leadership programmes to schools across NSW, Malaysia, Singapore and Papua-New Guinea.

As part of the event, O'Farrell also presented the Holy Child Auxilium School with books from the list for Premier's Reading Challenge, an initiative that promotes a love for reading among students in NSW.
